ROCKDALE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS GOALS:

Using FY23 results as a baseline measure, the district shall increase its CCRPI score each year by 3% of the gap between the baseline and 100.

HONEY CREEK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL GOALS:

Math – By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, HCE will see a 5% increase in 3rd -5th grade students, performing at the proficient and distinguished levels, in the area of math, as evidenced by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

ELA– By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, HCE will see a 5% increase in the $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ grade students, performing at the proficient and distinguished levels, in the in the area of English Language Arts, as evidenced by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

School Safety – By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, HCE will see a 10% decrease in the number of out-of-school suspensions when compared to the 2022-2023 school year, as a result of the implementation of Positive behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) structure with fidelity

Parent and Family Engagement: During the 2023-2024 school year HCE will provide monthly parent and family engagement opportunities.

To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, you, and your child will work together to:

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES: Honey Creek Elementary School will:

- *Provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables children to meet the State's student academic standards by:*
 - Providing support services to students in ELA and Math through whole class and smallgroup instruction, remediation, and enrichment groups, and EIP and tutoring safety nets based on progress monitoring data; and
 - Implementing various technology programs that support teaching and learning (Ex: MyON, Accelerated Reader, ThinkCERCA, Dreambox).
- *Keep parents updated on their child's current academic focus and performance through:*
 - *Two (2) parent/teacher conferences, one each semester; and*
 - Weekly/monthly newsletters or other forms of communication that explain classroom instructional focus and ideas for supporting families at home.
- Provide parents with reasonable access to staff:
 - Parents will have access to staff members for consultation during previously agreed upon, scheduled conference times within the school building or virtually; and
 - Staff will respond to phone or email communication within 24-hours of receipt.
- Provide parents opportunities to support their child's class and engage in activities as follows:
 - Parents are invited during Open House and Curriculum Nights to sign-up to support their child's classroom; and
 - Parents will be invited to HCE parent academies, Math, Literacy, and STEM Nights to support their child's academic achievement.

- Provide materials and training to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement and meet State and school goals through:
 - Parent workshops based on parent needs, requirements and interests;
 - Parent Resource Center (in the PBIS room) availability that provides parent access to materials they can check out and use at home; and
 - Curriculum Night to review standards of focus and assessments.
